

SAT INSTRUCTION

PROGRAM FAQs

What type of student would benefit from this program?

Students eager to improve their SAT score and who have an interest in coming to the USA to study. Students should be excited for this opportunity and have the maturity to benefit from such a program.

How much will my scores go up?

Our experience shows that adhering to a well-orchestrated program, including tutoring and individual studying, has significant results. Score gains vary by student with 100 to 200+ point improvements achievable.

How much studying is required?

This is a test preparation program and our primary goal is to improve students' SAT scores. Students will have three hours of classroom instruction and will have approximately an hour of homework each day. We understand that students work best when properly motivated and in a positive environment. The college visits are designed to show students the benefits of such studying.

The daily environment will be fun!

I am taking the SAT October 1st, won't I forget everything?

Repetition and review are key parts of the program. Students will be given a study schedule for August and September and will take two additional practice tests in their home country on September 10th and September 24th.

How did you select the universities to visit?

We have selected a range of universities that will highlight the many different educational opportunities in the USA. We will discuss with students the importance of finding the "best fit" college and show them how to do so.

How do I apply?

Students and families will then be contacted for a Skype interview.

What is included in the fee?

The fee includes: academic instruction, airport transportation, college visits, health insurance, housing, meals, and scheduled activities. Students are responsible for their own spending money and airfare.

How will I communicate with my child?

Parents are free to contact their students daily. Evening Boston time is most suitable for calls. Students will have the option to purchase a USA SIM card upon arrival. Free internet will be provided in the

dormitories. Email, Skype, and WhatsApp are popular ways as well. Cell phone use will not be permitted during class time or study time.

What do I wear?

Students are free to wear casual summer dress.

Where do students sleep?

Students will reside in college dormitories in Back Bay, Boston's most historic and elegant neighborhood. Students will be in double and triple rooms, grouped by gender.

What kind of Visa is required?

Students can attend the program with a B-2 tourist visa.

Can my child start a day earlier/later?

We cannot accommodate students arriving before July 11 or departing after July 29.

What if my child becomes sick or injured?

Boston is home to some of the world's best medical care. All students will be provided health insurance. During an emergency, a staff member will accompany the child and communicate with the family.

Who will supervise my child?

Our staff will be primarily made up of current students or recent graduates of American universities. They will be knowledgeable about cultural differences and expectations. There will be one counselor per six students.

Will the students be allowed to walk around Boston alone?

Parents may grant permission to students for such privileges. There will always be chaperoned options as well.

What is the weather like in Boston?

Boston summers are typically warm and sunny with some humidity. Average daily temperatures in July range from 24 to 29 degrees with cooler nights. Rain is possible.

What should my child pack?
